This year, Easter falls on April 1, 2018, April Fool's Day. April Fool's Day or as some have termed it, "All Fool's Day" is an annual celebration in some European and Western countries commemorated by playing practical jokes and spreading hoaxes. Some newspapers, magazines and other published media report fake stories, which are usually explained the next day or below the news section in small letters.
