Pastor Ted's Message



AND WHEN YOU GIVE

While serving as Pastor at the Christ Presbyterian Church in Hollywood and at the Wintersburg Presbyterian Church in Santa Ana, one of the questions that we wrestled with was the question, shall we publish the names of those who make donations and contributions to the church in the church newsletter.

After thoughtful prayer and discussion we recognized that our giving to the Lord needs to be in line with what the Bible teaches in this area. Our Lord Jesus spoke often about the motives and means by which we give. One of those places is found in Matthew 6:1-4 where our Lord Jesus said, "Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven. ² "So when you give, do not announce it with trumpets, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and on the streets, to be honored by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. ³ But when you give, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴ so that your giving may be in secret. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you."

In Matthew chapter 6, Jesus teaches about the proper attitude and motives that we need to have as we practice our spiritual disciplines. Jesus says we should do so in secret and anonymously. From your own study of God's Word, you may remember that the Pharisees were the most "religious" people of Jesus day. They often did things with the wrong motives. They would give, pray, and fast, not out of love or service unto the Lord, but to be seen and recognized by others. In that sense, Jesus said in verse 1 that they would not be rewarded in by our Father in Heaven, but that they had already received there reward because they gained the approval of others.

On the contrary, Jesus taught that when we give we should do so anonymously and in secret and that the Lord who sees what is done in secret will reward those who give in secret.

Ultimately the approval of God is much greater than the approval and recognition of others. That is why Jesus says in verses 3-4 ³ But when you give, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴ so that your giving may be in secret. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

To apply this, for the last two issues of the Echoes, the names of those who have given to the work and ministry of the church have not been published. It is truly the hope and desire of the leadership of El Estero that those who give will be blessed and rewarded by God, which is much better.

Thank you to all who give to the work and ministry of the Lord. May God truly cause His face to shine upon you and reward you for your giving. In Christ, Pastor Ted

Pastor's Report: Rev. Ted Esaki. Visitations: He has now visited with most of the people in the church and those who have become hospitalized. Dr. Pat Zukeran will deliver a sermon and will be available to answer questions during a brown bag lunch on Sunday, July 5, 2015. He is very well recognized and a sought after speaker in apologetics based in Hawaii. He is in the area to attend the JEMS Conference at Mt. Hermon. Junko Nishiguchi Cheng will provide worship music that morning. She held a concert performance at El Estero a few years ago.

Church Corporation Meeting: Treasurer's Report: Yuri Wong, Corporation and Church Treasurer. Outflow was more than double of Inflow last month as a result a decrease in contributions combined with the expenses associated with the Stair Replacement Project. The project expenses continue to be less than the projected budget. Donations made for the One Great Hour of Sharing totaled \$500. Check has been sent to the Synod of the Pacific.

Deacons Report: Deacons have asked for volunteers to host small group gatherings so our Pastor can get to know people better in a more informal setting.

Administrative Branch: Building & Grounds Committee: Stair Replacement Project work continues. 2 Custom made metal handrails will be fabricated for the exterior stairway. Personnel Committee: Yuri Wong has asked to be released from the Personnel Committee. Johnnie Montoya will join the committee. Outreach Branch: Richard Marquez, Chair. Breakfast on Mother's Day had great food and participation. Father's Day: Yae Kuwatani coordinated. Her committee cooked and served an indoor picnic on June 21st. Asian Art Fair: Those making crafts are asked to not begin new projects or purchase additional supplies until the AAF Committee meets to discuss projects and food items. A meeting for those interested in participating in the AAF may be announced soon. Church Photo: We will be contacting photographers to schedule a church photo on Easter Sunday 2016. Also exploring having a "Get Together" or reunion with those who participated in the Tri-Church youth group.

Spiritual Growth Branch. Don Chin, Chair. Our church pianist will be on unpaid leave during June and July. Marilyn Uwate has scheduled musicians to fill Sundays. Children's Sunday school: Marilyn Uwate is to meet with Nora Shen and Marlene Sato to discuss ideas based on the Beginners Bible. Rev. Ted Esaki shared that he spoke to Children's Ministry Director at Wintersburg about our situation. The director is willing to share, at no cost, resources and ideas. Don Chin conducted multi-media training on May 18th on how to operate power point, screen, and projector. Rev. Ted Esaki indicated he can play his guitar if a pianist becomes ill.

Commissioner to the Presbytery of San Jose Meeting: Dick Wong. Meeting held on Saturday, June 6, 2015. Presbytery voted to approve Rev. Jason Barraca as temporary part-time pastor of Lincoln Avenue Presbyterian Church, Rev. Craig Roberts resignation from COM, and the Liaison to El Estero from COM, Elder Frank Bernstein, was elected as the Chair of the Committee on Ministry.

Future Events: The Annual Elder and Deacon Training will be held on July 11, 2015 from 9 AM – 2 PM. A Session Meeting will be held immediately afterwards.








Father's Day
