## **Thanksgiving Thoughts**

## Living a Life of Thanksgiving to the Lord

For God's people, Thanksgiving is far more than a special day on the calendar. The Bible urges us to live a life of thanksgiving each day. Being thankful to God for all of His blessings is truly a mark of the Christian. So let me give you four biblical ways to express your thanksgiving to the Lord at this wonderful season of the year. The base I want to build on is Psalm 100, a song of praise to God as our Creator, Sustainer and Redeemer.

I see at least four ways that Psalm 100 instructs us to praise and worship God. Some may be a little scary to those who are not used to joyously expressing praise, but I encourage you not to be afraid!

## 1. Don't Be Afraid to Shout Praise to the Lord.

The Bible says, "Make a joyful shout to the LORD" In the Bible, shouting is associated with great achievement or joy. Joshua told Israel to march around Jericho for six days and on the seventh day to lift a great shout. When they did, the walls fell down.

When you are thanking and praising God, don't be afraid to be a little loud. God loves to hear our praises, and it will also make you biblical!

### 2. Don't Be Afraid to Serve the Lord with Gladness.

"Serve the LORD with gladness" Gladness means mirth, gaiety and happiness. No service to the Lord, whether great or small, should be done grudgingly.

Sincere and true delight in service to God should accompany our words and deeds of worship. When you are serving the Lord, don't be afraid to do it with a glad heart—and don't be afraid to smile!

### 3. Don't Be Afraid to Come into the Lord's Presence.

"Come before His presence with singing" God calls us to come into His presence privately each day and together in corporate worship. "Evening and morning and at noon I will pray, and cry aloud, and He shall hear my voice." It was said of the fledgling New Testament church that they met daily in the temple for teaching from the Word, fellowship, worship and praise. Little wonder that Hebrews 10:25 begs us not to fail to regularly assemble with other believers in thanksgiving, hearing the Word and worship.

### 4. Don't Be Afraid to Get to Know the Lord.

The rest of Psalm 100:says, "Know that the LORD, He is God; It is He who has made us, and not we ourselves; We are His people and the sheep of His pasture" (emphasis added). The psalmist calls the people to recognize and "know" God's words, works and ways.

He wants us to know that He is Jehovah God and we are not, that He is the Creator and we are His creatures and that we are His sheep and He is our Shepherd.

The heart-longing of every godly person is to get to know God more intimately.

Let's make it our determination to praise and worship God this holiday season!

#### **Devotion**:

Pastor George Doyal, moderator for session. John 16:33 "These things I have spoken to you, that in me you might have peace. In the world you shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world." What does that mean? Trials, hardships and difficulties? Being a Christian doesn't mean you don't have any trials, tensions and stresses like those in a family. Focus on the peace you have in Christ. He is with you, will strengthen you.

Church Corporation: Don Chin, Chair. Stewardship Pledge letter has been developed and will be distributed to the Congregation along with proposed church budget for 2015 and pledge cards to be returned. Presbytery of San Jose: Elder Frank Bernstein, Liaison to El Estero Presbyterian along with Rev. Chris Williams and Ret. Rev. Jay Bartow who are members of the Committee on Ministry attended the Session Meeting. They indicated their feeling it is important for the church to consider hiring an Interim Pastor. The salary package of an Interim must earn no less than what the previous pastor received. Session members were able to speak with them and ask questions about the process of searching for a new pastor.

**Deacons**: emailed report received. Deacons wish to discontinue hand washing for Communion. Session will invite the Deacons to the next Session meeting to discuss the service and Celebration of the Lord's Supper. Deacons wish to discontinue support of Nancy's Project. Session voted to continue Outreach support of Nancy's Project, as well as continue support of food drives for Loaves & Fishes, the Salvation Army and the Monterey County Food Bank by rotating which organization has a barrel on church premises.

Administrative Branch: Building & Grounds: Work on the Stair Replacement project is continuing. Worship Service will be moved downstairs temporarily when the outside stairway is removed. Janitorial service hours will change to Thursday morning every other week. Session expressed appreciation for Gene Lee who has been setting out the ramps and opening gates to the back parking area on Sunday mornings. The front doors to church were found ajar twice in the past 3 weeks. The locking mechanism might not always latch securely. A lock smith will be called. The downstairs locks have been changed for better security. Safe Church: Mandatory Reporter Training was completed by Teruyo Petrocelli and Yuri Wong on November 8<sup>th</sup> at Foothill Presbyterian. Training is required by the Presbytery of San Jose for all officers, staff, Sunday school teachers and those who come into contact with young children and the elderly in their church ministries. Church Nominating Committee: has met to review desired qualities of officers according to the Bible and Book of Order.

Outreach Branch: 10 members plan on attending the Organic Outreach Conference later this month.

Commissioner to the meetings of the Presbytery of San Jose: Dick Wong has been appointed commission to represent El Estero at San Jose Presbytery meetings.

#### **Vacant Pastor Position**

Session had its first meeting with the Commission on Ministry representatives of the San Jose Presbytery. They have provided direction, guidance and prayers in our search for a new pastor. It may be a lengthy process which the session is embarked upon. Please pray with the leadership that God in his infinite wisdom and love will show us His plan for El Estero.

#### **Deacons Notes**

Junki attended Nomination meeting before Service Nov 9. Aiko and Kaz finishing one year terms. Kaz declined another term, Aiko to consider another term. The Board unanimously decided to discontinue symbolic/ritual of Hand Washing for future Communion Service. Foods will be collected during November for the Loaves and Fishes food pantry. Canned and dry goods, breakfast food appreciated. Deacons will make toiletry packages on Dec 14 after Worship Service/Brief Deacons Meeting. Anyone willing to help after Service is invited. Deacons will not collect children gifts this year. Christmas cards to be sent out to friends Dec 7 after Worship. File of Life update cards will be distributed in January 2015.
